In one of his journal notations Thomas Merton writes that we are always thinking that our life will truly be happy "when." Today The United Methodist Church supports 11 historically Black colleges and universities, more than any other religious denomination.

Together, with all United Methodist Churches around the world, we support leadership for life by trying to pay our Ministry Shares 100 percent. 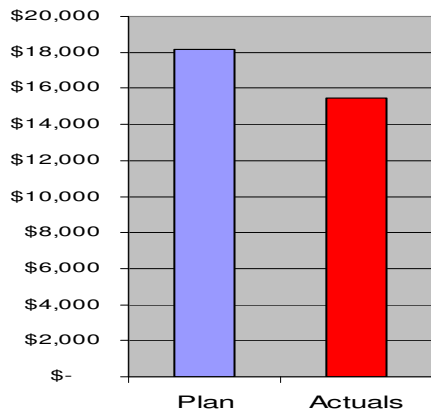

## SPOTLIGHT ON OUR NURSERY SCHOOL

### Helping Children Feel Good About Themselves

Building a child's self-esteem has always been and continues to be a major goal of **St. Andrew's Nursery School & Kindergarten**. It should also play an extremely important role as we parent and grandparent our own children.

High self-esteem makes you glad that you are you. It is imperative that we instill this feeling in our children, but how? Sometimes we undermine our children's sense of self-worth without even realizing it. How can we be sure that we are doing the right things?

Whenever possible, focus on the positive rather than the negative. For example, if we point out our child's flaws, he will only know what is wrong with him. Instead, we must remember to point out what is good and right about our children. Praise is very beneficial to a child's positive self-image, but not if we lavish praise on every little thing he does. Be specific. Giving a child descriptive and meaningful praise will clearly tell him the many things about him that you like and are proud of. He will feel both lovable and capable.

Encouraging a child to be as independent as possible will also make him feel more competent and capable. Let him do all that he can without your help. Remember, it doesn't have to be perfect to be good and acceptable! Constantly helping your child with homework

or school projects, taking over if the child loses interest or gets discouraged is not beneficial in the long run. A child who never does anything on his own begins to believe that he can't.

When disciplining a child, focus on the unacceptable *action* rather than on the *child*. Phrases like, "What is the matter with you" or "How could you be so stupid" will destroy a child's self-worth in no time. The child will literally begin to believe that he *is* stupid if he hears it often enough. Children believe they are what YOU think they are. Tell them often that you think they are wonderful, and *never, ever* withhold your affection if your child does something you don't approve of.

A parent can make a child feel proud even when he fails. Hugs and love and praise can be given just for trying. Let him know that it's ok to fail, but it's not ok to quit trying. (Remember The Little Engine That Could – "I think I can, I think I can!!") Spend time with your child. Let him know that he is a priority in your life, no matter how busy you are. Look him in the eye when he talks to you and really listen. Let him know that what he has to say is important to you. This will show your child that you respect him as a person. And what better gift to give a child!!
